President's Message Happy New Year

"Out with the old. In with the new!"

This common, New Year's phrase has been taken literally at the gallery. If you haven't noticed, (you have to look "up") our frayed old gallery sign has been replaced with a new, aluminum version that will be more weather resistant. And, in a stroke of genius, Phil Murillo, the artist who designed and installed the new sign, took the old sign, added a bit of paint and glaze, and created a wonderful abstract piece of art that is now hanging in the gallery as part of the "Abstracts and Valley Impressions" exhibit. Congratulations, Phil!

Another "new" addition, beginning in 2020, is a small grand piano, which not only adds to the sophisticated ambiance of the gallery, but will be available for the cabarets we and Opera Modesto have scheduled for the coming year. It also gives us the opportunity to entice other organizations to use our facility for their small, classy events. Because of the piano, the gallery has already been booked for a piano recital in May.

The addition of the piano is courtesy of Christopher Bengochea, an operatic tenor (he starred in Opera Modesto's Carmen earlier this past year), piano tuner, supporter of the arts, and all around "good guy." At one last year's cabaret performances, Chris made the remark that it wasn't appropriate for great singers to be accompanied by an electronic instrument and he would look into doing something about it. He also wasn't keen about the high cost of bringing in a grand piano for special events. Several months ago,

he was able to purchase a small grand from one his customers and decided to leave it on relatively permanent loan at our gallery. Although it may be removed temporarily for other events around town, such as the production of Mansfield Park at the State Theater in January, it is ours to use and share.

One additional note re. Chris and the piano, is that he and his wife, Sandra, also an opera singer and vocal instructor at Stan State and San Jose State, will be appearing in our cabaret series in September of 2020, performing a pop, Broadway, jazz, blues, rock, opera, crossover concert. (He won't tell me what, exactly, but says it will be highly entertaining and not opera based.)

Beyond that, I'm looking forward to a year filled with artistically exciting events at the gallery. Several highlight



in our exhibit season come to mind. In February, fotoMODESTO will be featuring Collision VI, an always popular poetry/ photography, event, coupled with a special showing of The Modestan, a



retrospective look at Modesto through the lens of Adrian Mendoza - a Bee photographer and Modesto chronicler for several decades. In June, Chella, Rick Ingraham, and Carson Grubaugh will be hosting an invitational, juried Plein Air Show. And, in July there will be an event-filled show focused on the celebration of the 19th amendment - woman's suffrage - and women's acheivements in America. And these are just a few highlights to our other great shows and the schedule of Expose Yourself (to Art) lectures and our popular Grace Lieberman Cabaret series. More info on those inside.

The first concert, March 14, will feature **Synergy Chamber Players** presenting pieces both classical and contemporary in nature in **Music of the Americas**. As an added bonus, local artist, Nicole Slater, painting a piece inspired by the concert as they play.

Sandra and Christopher Bengochea will present an exciting vocal concert on September 12 featuring "a little

The final concert of the season, November 7, is the **Rykert Trio**, vocalists who recently won the Valley Talent Project. Joe Rykert is also a cancer survivor and their show is scheduled to be a part of our Healing Arts exhibit, sponsored by Memorial Medical Center's Complementary Therapy program. Their show is an eclectic blend of contemporary and inspirational music.

Ticket prices of \$50 (VIP Table Seating), \$30 (General Admission) and \$20 (Student) include refreshments and dessert. CCAA members are entitled to \$40 VIP tickets.

The Modestan: A Photographic Portrait of Modesto, 1975 – 2015, featuring photographs by Adrian Mendoza, will be on display at the Mistlin Gallery between February 4 and February 28, 2020. On Thursday evening, February 13th, beginning at 6:00 pm, The gallery will host a reception for the artist. At

that time, Adrian will present a slide show and lecture titled, **#OKBoomer: 45 Years** of Photography by Adrian Mendoza. Every picture tells a Modesto story.

Adrian began his documentation of the life and times of Modesto in 1975. For 17 years he was a staff photographer for the Modesto Bee. Following the downsizing of the Bee in 2008, Adrian invested his time, energy, and money in airplane rentals and continued his chronicling of Modesto and the surrounding areas from the air. Although he moved to San Francisco in 2011 and then to Santa Rosa in 2013, Adrian says, "I will never be a San Franciscan or a Santa Rosan. I am a Modestan."

Doors open at 6:30 and the program begins at 7:00. The purpose of this "lecture" series is to expand views and

knowledge about all the arts and is free and open to the public.
